Fall Commencement

The 2019 Fall graduation ceremony was held on Saturday, December 14th. The College of BIS graduated 3 Master of Science in Analytics (MSA) students, 2 Master of Science in Health Informatics and Information Management (MSHIIM) students, and 10 Master of Science in Information Systems (MSIS) students.

In addition, undergraduates in the College of BIS completing their degrees included 28 baccalaureate students and 6 associate students. There were several baccalaureate students graduating with honors comprised of 1 with Summa Cum Laude (3.9 GPA or above) honors, 2 with Magna Cum Laude (3.7 to less than 3.9 GPA) honors, 2 with Cum Laude (3.5 to less than 3.7 GPA) honors, and 1 associate graduate with Highest Honor (3.9 GPA or above) distinction. From the College of BIS, there were 5 students receiving designation as graduates with Center of Excellence in Computer Information Systems honor and 3 students receiving designation as graduates of the Delta Mu Delta national honor society for students majoring in business administration. There were 4 graduating members of the National Society of Leadership and Success (Sigma Alpha Pi) from the College of BIS.

The College of BIS had three students complete the PhD in Information Systems degree. Arnold Nzailu's dissertation was titled "Information Security Awareness Programs in Congolese Organizations: Cultural Influence and Effective Use" and his dissertation chair was Dr. Insu Park. Adaptive Gaming Controllers

Dr. Chris Olson, associate professor of information systems and coordinator of the undergraduate computer information systems program, worked with Dr. Justin Blessinger and Rob Honomichl on the development of features for adaptive gaming controllers. Using a Microsoft Xbox adaptive controller designed specifically for those with disabilities to help make user input for video games more accessible, and with the help of a 3D printer on campus and hardware from Honomichl's courses, Blessinger and Olson were able to gather devices, switches and controls to customize and create additional adaptable controllers that are unique to the players. HIM Accreditation



Dakota State University's health information management programs participated in submission of a self-study report and site visit by a team of peer-reviewers in the reaccreditation process for the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM) of the undergraduate programs. Programmatic academic accreditation provides an independent, objective evaluation of a program's education quality and workforce preparation. Both the associate degree in health information technology (AS in HIT) and the baccalaureate degree in health information administration (BS in HIA) were certified as meeting the educational standards for a health information management program and were awarded continuing accreditation. The Master of Science in Health Informatics and Information Management (MSHIIM) program received candidacy status with CAHIIM for accreditation.

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Program Fair




Holiday Decorating
